

17th December 2021: Document List for Afghan Admission Programme

Any documents that are not in English need to be translated by an official translator.

If your family are sending you copies of documents from Afghanistan, they must get the copy of the document stamped by a lawyer, notary public, commissioner for oaths or someone from the Red Cross, UNHCR or IOM. The person stamping the document must write "True copy of the original", their name, address and profession on the document, and must stamp it with their office stamp.

If you are sending the application by **email** the department want you to send **certified copies**. This means that the documents must be stamped by a solicitor who must write "true copy of the original" on the document. If you are sending the application by **post** the documents can be **originals** or **certified copies**.

You may not be able to get all of these documents or they may not apply to your application. Please try to get as many of the below documents as possible and we will discuss the exact requirements with you in detail.
