Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection

The European Union has agreed a Temporary Protection measure to offer quick and effective assistance to people fleeing the war in Ukraine.

This means you will be granted temporary protection for at least one year in Ireland should you wish to avail of it. This protection allows you to work, and provides access to health services, accommodation, education for children and other social supports.

This measure means that you do not need to go through the asylum procedure to secure a residence permission. If you change your mind, you will be allowed to apply for asylum. The basic right to apply for asylum remains unaffected by this protection measure. The 90 day permission you get on arrival gives you time to think.

Accommodation

You should tell immigration officials that you need a place to stay when you arrive in Ireland, and they will refer you to the Government's Ukraine Crisis Temporary Accommodation Team (UCTAT).

There is a shortage of accommodation, and the type of place you will be offered depends on what is available at that time. You may have to stay in a community centre, sports ground or in tented accommodation for a period.

If you stay in accommodation where food is provided, you must pay a contribution of €10 per day for adults, and €5 per day for each child. You do not have to pay for your first 2 weeks. If you refuse to pay, you could be asked to leave.

If you refuse one offer of accommodation, you will not get any more offers. For more information, read the <u>frequently asked questions about IPAS</u> <u>accommodation (pdf)</u>.

One short-term absence from IPAS accommodation of up to 7 days (over a 6-month period), may be allowed in exceptional circumstances. Absence requests are decided on a case-by-case basis. You can read more about <u>absences from short-term IPAS</u> <u>accommodation</u>.

Accommodation

If you don't need a place to stay immediately (because you are staying with family or friends), you can ask for this help at any time later on.

If you need accommodation and you are already in Ireland, you can email <u>ukrainetempaccom@equality.gov.ie</u>.

You may have to wait until accommodation is available. Include the following information in your email:

- The full name of anyone who needs accommodation,
- Dates of birth,
- Phone number,
- Where you are now (the full address, if you have one),
- When you need the accommodation (for example, from tonight), and
- Medical conditions, disabilities, allergies and dietary requirements.

Accommodation

Please keep in mind that there is a severe accommodation shortage. All Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection requiring assistance with accommodation are offered short-term accommodation by the State. This may include pledged accommodation, vacant homes or serviced accommodation.

The type of accommodation, geographic location and duration of stay will depend on what is available at that time. The decision of the Department, in terms of its offer of accommodation and its suitability, is final.

Please note that given the number of people that are being accommodated, unfortunately it is not possible to develop tailored solutions for individuals or families.

Hosting Ukrainians

If you are providing accommodation to refugees from Ukraine, you can apply for a monthly <u>Accommodation</u> <u>Recognition Payment (ARP)</u> of €800 per property. You must commit to providing accommodation for at least 6 months.



Once you have your MyGovID account (basic or verified), you need to go to the MyWelfare website, <u>here</u>. You will see information about the ARP. Click 'apply'.



How to apply:

After following the instructions on the previous page, log in to your MyGovID account. You will need to enter your email address and password.


If you have a verified account, after you enter your password, you will receive a text message with a code.

Finding Employment

You have the right to work in Ireland when you have your Temporary Protection permission letter. You can also work for yourself (self-employment) and you can access vocational training in Ireland.

Help finding work

To get Jobseeker's Allowance you must be available for and looking for full-time work. You must be able to show proof of this to the Department of Social Protection.

You can work part-time, but you should keep looking for full-time work. You can get help finding work from the Intreo employment services.

You can:

- Talk to an Employment Support Officer at your local Intreo centre or branch office.
- Go to an employment support event being organised near you for Ukrainians. You should get an invite, but you can attend without one.



Finding Employment

CORU is working to support health and social care professionals from Ukraine seeking to register and work in Ireland.



They have set up a dedicated contact email address for applicants from Ukraine. Ukrainians can contact them directly at <u>ukraine@coru.ie</u> to ask questions, seek help, or to apply to register with CORU.

It currently has registers open for the following professions:

- Dietitians
- Occupational Therapists
- Medical Scientists
- Radiographers and Radiation Therapists
- Social Workers
- Speech and Language Therapists
- Optometrists and Dispensing Opticians
- Physiotherapists
- Podiatrists

Bank accounts

All EU residents have the right to a 'basic bank account', no matter their financial situation or where they live in the EU.

A 'basic bank account' is a current account that allows you to have access to essential daily banking services if you do not currently have a bank account in Ireland.



Medical & Counselling

Health services in Ireland are delivered by Ireland's public healthcare service - the <u>Health Service Executive</u> (HSE).

You can get the same <u>public healthcare services as</u> <u>people who live in Ireland</u>. Everyone coming to Ireland under the Temporary Protection Directive can apply for a medical card with a simplified application process. A medical card allows you to visit a doctor for free, access other health services and get medicines at a reduced price. Children aged 16 and over must apply for a medical card separately.

You should apply for your medical card using a special <u>medical card application form (pdf</u>) for people from Ukraine. The medical card application form is also available in <u>Ukrainian (pdf</u>). You can email your completed form to <u>PCRS.Applications@HSE.ie</u>, or you can post it to the address on the form.

You need:

- Your name, current address and date of birth.
- Your Personal Public Service (PPS) number <u>(see above)</u>.
- Your doctor's (GP's) address, stamp and signature. If you do not know any GPs, one will be assigned to you and your family.

Medical & Counselling

You can get information about health care services in Ireland from the <u>HSE website</u>. You can also read about the <u>Irish health system in Ukrainian</u>.

Vaccinations in Ireland



To avail of this journey, please show the following at the ticket office of your departure station:

- A Ukrainian passport
- Evidence of arrival within the previous seven days to Ireland (e.g airline / ferry boarding card stub or confirmation email) OR
- Confirmation from a registered charity involved in the Ukrainian crisis response

All children under the age of 5 will be able to travel for free on all publicly-funded services. These services include Bus Éireann (including Expressway), Luas, Irish Rail and Dublin Bus.(Please note that Airlink and Hop-On, Hop-Off sightseeing tours are not included.)

Transport



To get Free Travel you must be living in Ireland and meet one of the following conditions:

- You are aged 66 or over,
- You are getting <u>Disability Allowance</u>, <u>Blind</u> <u>Pension</u>, <u>Carer's Allowance</u> or an <u>Invalidity</u> <u>Pension</u>,
- You are blind or visually impaired and meet the medical conditions for Blind Pension,
- You have been getting Incapacity Supplement or Workmen's Compensation with Disablement Pension for at least 12 months,
- You are a specified carer for a person getting Constant Attendance Allowance or Prescribed Relative's Allowance,
- You are getting a social security invalidity payment (or similar payment) from another EU member state or from a country with which Ireland has a bilateral social security agreement for at least 12 months.
